

Students Report Seeking Assigned Advisor's Advice:

- 69% of students see their advisor when learning the requirements of the major.
- 63% see their advisor when selecting courses.
- 63% see their advisor when learning about graduation requirements.
- 54% see their advisor about registration (adding, dropping, substituting courses).

Students Say They Look Elsewhere, Too:

- 73% seek the advice of other students when selecting their courses.
- 65% consult the Bulletin to learn about LMU's academic policies.
- 64% consult the Bulletin to learn what they need to take to graduate.
- 58% use PROWL Degree Audit (CAPP) to learn how many courses they have left to graduate.

Students Turn To Their Families:

- For help with:
 - Personal Problems 72%
 - Career Planning 54%
 - Improving Academic Performance 44%

Students seek help from their families more often regarding these issues than anyone else (except their friends for personal problems).

Sources Most Often Cited by Students For Help With Improving Academic Performance:

- 44% Family
- 41% Friends
- 27% Other Faculty (not Advisor) or
the Department Chair
- 16% University Staff Members
