The remaining representatives shall be elected by the LMUCCAB in the academic year. These representatives shall serve for a term of two years, with a maximum of two consecutive terms. Should it be determined that a representative is not able to complete their term the LMUCCAB may have another person appointed to fill the remainder of the term.
