

CAMPUS AND FACILITIES ACCESS POLICY

Approved by Cabinet, October 3, 2007

Policy Statement

Loyola Marymount University (“LMU” or “the University”) is a private university and its campuses, facilities, buildings and properties are private property. Access to LMU, its campuses, facilities, buildings and properties are permitted only with LMU’s consent which may be withdrawn at any time for any reason.

Process

In order to protect the safety, security and tranquility of LMU and its campus community, LMU requires that all LMU community members, visitors, and others present at its campus or facilities carry appropriate photo identification while at LMU or any of its campuses or facilities. In this connection, LMU community members are required to carry, and produce upon request, their LMU OneCard.

The LMU Department of Public Safety (“DPS”) is primarily responsible for the safety and security of LMU community, including students, faculty, staff, and visitors, on the Westchester campus. To that effect, anyone visiting the Westchester campus is required to provide the following information upon request from DPS:

- An LMU OneCard or other officially recognized form of photo identification (e.g. government issued drivers license or identification card, passport or similar document).
- If you are not an LMU community member, the name of the specific LMU community member you are visiting on campus.
- If you are not an LMU community member, you must state the purpose of your visit.
- Minors (under the age of 18) are normally not permitted on campus unless accompanied by an adult who is an LMU community member or an adult who is otherwise then permitted to be on campus.
- Pets or other animals are normally not allowed on campus (including being walked or in a vehicle) unless they are an authorized service animal (e.g. dog assisting visually impaired individual, police dogs, etc.). Violators will be requested to immediately remove the animal from campus. Refer to Animal Policy for more details.

Failure to comply with the request of DPS personnel will result in the revocation of the University’s permission for you to be present on campus or in or at a University facility and, as a result, you will be required to immediately leave campus and the subject facility. Failure to leave the campus or facility as requested will result in the filing of a trespassing complaint with the appropriate law enforcement agency.
