Dr. Reichard's CASTL project, Cultivating Legal Literacy in a Free Speech Class: How Undergraduate Students Develop Deeper Understandings of the Law, examined how undergraduates learn about law in an upper division free speech class. His research interests include the socio-legal history of 19th and early 20th century territorial New Mexico, the scholarship of teaching and learning, and gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and queer (GLBTQ) history in the United States, specifically an emerging research project examining the history of GLBT student activism in California.
