

Personal Transportation Policy

I. Introduction

Loyola Marymount University permits students, faculty and staff to use skateboards, bicycles, razors, rollerblades, etc. for transportation outdoors throughout campus.

II. Policy

Use of these modes of transportation for other purposes (i.e. tricks, jumps, rail sliding, grinds) is a violation of the Student Conduct Code. Further, riders are entrusted to use common sense and respect in their use of skateboard, bicycles, razors, etc. for transportation. The policy is based on good faith and maturity. Riders are expected to exercise care and courtesy as they pass pedestrians on campus, especially from behind. Riders must not impede traffic or cause an obstruction of motorized vehicles or pedestrians.

Policy Clarifications:

- A. The bridge between University Hall and the Leavey Campus is designated for pedestrian traffic only.
- B. Riders are expected to obey all campus traffic signs, including stop signs.
- C. Stay in designated bike lanes whenever possible and refrain from riding in or traversing traffic lanes. Care must be taken at all intersections.
- D. Skateboards, razors and rollerblades may not be ridden down the hill to University Hall. The specific off limits area is: Leavey Road and sidewalk from the stop sign at the Southwest end of Rains Hall to the East end of University Hall.
- E. Hitching onto another moving vehicle is prohibited.
- F. Riding personal transportation is prohibited inside all campus buildings.

III. Enforcement

Public Safety will determine if the rider is proceeding dangerously or without consideration of others. Those who violate this policy may be subject to the following sanctions:

First Violation:

Citation will be given and a \$50 fine.

The mode of transportation will be confiscated. The Director of Public Safety will return it after a meeting with the rider.

Second and subsequent violations:

Citation will be given and a \$50 fine.

The mode of transportation will be confiscated.

Rider will be referred to Judicial Affairs.
