- Extended hours on Wednesdays until 7 p.m.

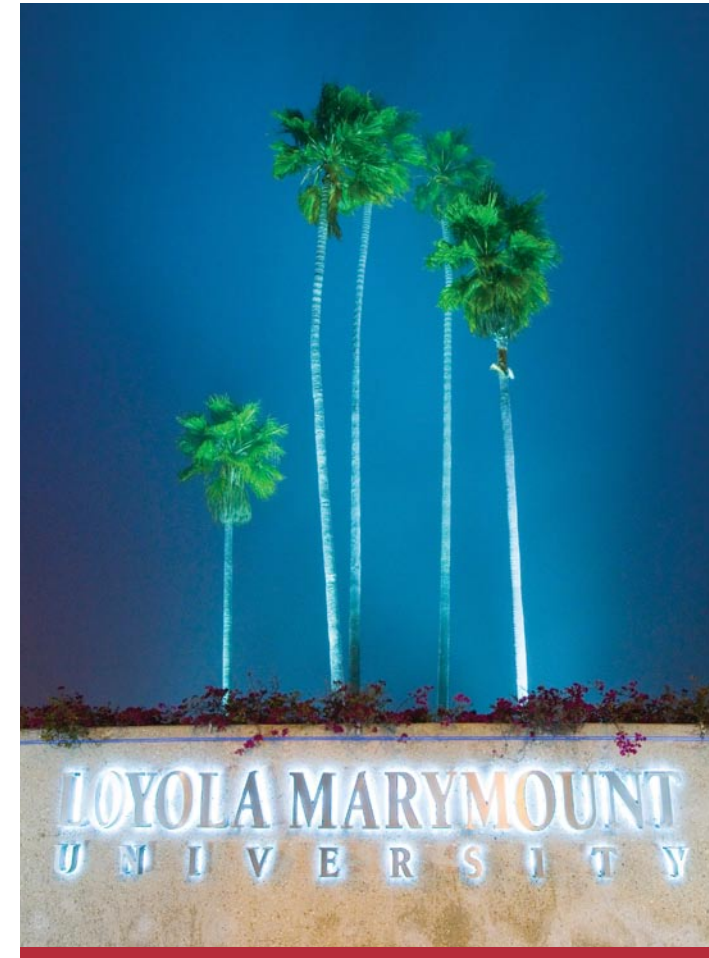

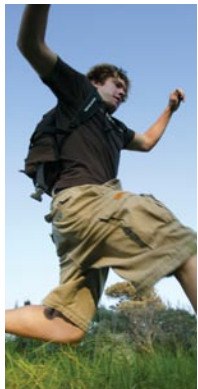

THE STUDENT HEALTH CENTER

LMU's Student Health Center is a full-service medical clinic available to students. ***It is accredited by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care.***

THE SHC STAFF INCLUDES:

- Board certified internist
- Certified nurse practitioners
- Registered nurses
- Medical assistants
- X-ray technologist
- Professional front office staff



SHC OFFERS A WIDE RANGE OF SERVICES:

- Treatment for illnesses and injuries
- Women's health services
- Dermatological care
- Medications
- Immunizations and allergy shots
- Laboratory and X-ray services
- Health education and programs

Please note that SHC does not provide services relating to work-related injuries or offer work-related physicals.

ELIGIBILITY

- Health services are available to all full-time students.

COST

- Patients are charged for prescribed medications, lab work, X-rays, and necessary medical supplies.
- Graduate and law students pay \$50 per semester when they access the Student Health Center.
- Charges are billed directly to the student's account. Flexi-Dollars are also accepted.

HEALTH INSURANCE

- LMU requires that all full-time undergraduate and graduate students be covered by health insurance in case of accidents, hospitalizations and special conditions. Students without medical insurance coverage are required to purchase the university-endorsed health insurance plan through United Healthcare.

CONFIDENTIALITY

- Medical records are confidential and are kept separate from all other university records. Records of students 18 years and older will not be released without the student's consent.
