

## Amplified Events

---

### What is an Amplified Event?

- An event is amplified if it utilizes a public address system and speakers at an outdoor venue.
- Amplified events include, but are not limited to bands, DJs and speakers.

### Scheduling an Amplified Event

- Only registered student groups and University departments may sponsor an amplified event.
- Registered student groups must submit an Activity Planner to Student Leadership & Development requesting amplification. Student Leadership & Development maintains a calendar containing all amplified events during the academic year and will approve the event.
- Student Leadership & Development will preview the amplified event to insure compatibility with the University's mission.

### Amplified Event Hours

- Weekday amplified events are permitted Tuesdays and Thursdays between 12:15pm and 1:20pm.
- Friday and Weekend amplified events must abide by the following time restrictions:
  - Friday: 5:00 pm - Midnight
  - Saturday: 10:00 am – Midnight (*Outdoor Concerts must end by 10:00 pm*)
  - Sunday: 11:00 am – 8:00 pm
- No amplified events are permitted while classes are in session.
- No amplified events are permitted on Church holy days, during Church services or during finals week.
- Only one amplified event may occur at any given time, unless prior approval is granted from Student Leadership & Development.

### Policies

- All amplified events must be compatible with the University's mission. Profanity of any kind is prohibited at any time during amplified events.
- Student groups must always be conscious of the proximity to residential living areas and the surrounding neighborhood.
- All amplified events must be booked at least one week prior to the event. LMU Community Relations will notify community members as needed.
- At no time shall amplified events begin prior to 10:00 am on any day of the week.
- Amplification must not impede the operation of University offices, departments or existing events.
- No amplified events may occur outside of University Hall, except on the patio next to The Roski Dining.
- Student groups must comply with University staff if requested to lower the volume or end amplification at an event.
- Given the large number of requests for amplified Convocation Hour events and the low number of available dates, a maximum of two events per month for each student group is permitted.
