Since October 2012, LMU has created 338 named scholarships - 252 for undergraduates and 86 for graduate students. Of those 338 scholarships, 199 are endowed, carrying these benefits far into LMU's future.

Green LMU

1st in the 2022 campus Race to Zero Waste Competition (formerly Recyclemania) in Food Organics, Diversion, and Per Capita Recycling, over 1 MWh a year of clean energy produced on campus from solar. LMU also gained recognition as a **United Nations observer**, membership of the United Nations Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) and a signatory of the United Nations Principles for Responsible Investment.

LMU has reduced its water consumption by nearly 2 million gallons per year (estimated).

- removed 210,000 square feet of turf on Drollinger Field, which saved an additional estimated 1 million gallons of water
- replaced aging washing machines with Energy Star Units that save an estimated 880,000 gallons a year
- installed low-flow aerators on sinks and low-flow shower heads across campus to reduce sink and shower water consumption by 55%.

100% of campus sprinklers respond automatically to local weather conditions.

About three-quarters of the campus uses reclaimed water for irrigation.

Started recycling in **1990**; first campus-wide collegiate recycling program in California, **1993**.

One of the first campuses in the state to recycle **100%** of green waste.

LMU has eight LEED-certificated buildings, silver and gold.
